

Fit for a £40k revamp

VISITORS to a green spot won't just be taking in the view when they drop by - they could also be getting fit thanks to a £40k boost.

The Friends of Victoria Park group is planning a host of improvements including a trim trail after winning two grants.

The Big Lottery Fund will be paying for the trail to be used by keen walkers and joggers as part of the £43,000 works.

It will also be used for a huge mural in the under-fives play area, 30 mosaic stepping stones with a wildlife theme and balance beams and a totem pole created by chain-saw artist Mick Burns.

The work is due to be unveiled in October.
