Physical changes to, better management and increased usage of parks can help to 'crowd out crime' from an area.

3. Need a breath of fresh air?

Well designed and maintained parks encourage people to exercise, and in turn, reduces stress.

4. Want to increase the value of your home?

A good park also offers very clear benefits to the local economy in terms of stimulating increased house prices, since house-buyers are willing to pay more to be near green spaces.

5. Want to get to know your neighbours?

Properly designed and cared for parks can bring communities together, providing meeting places and a community event venue.

6. Want to wake up to the birds singing?

Victoria Park provides us with an opportunity to be close to nature. This brings with it positive impacts in terms of mental health.
